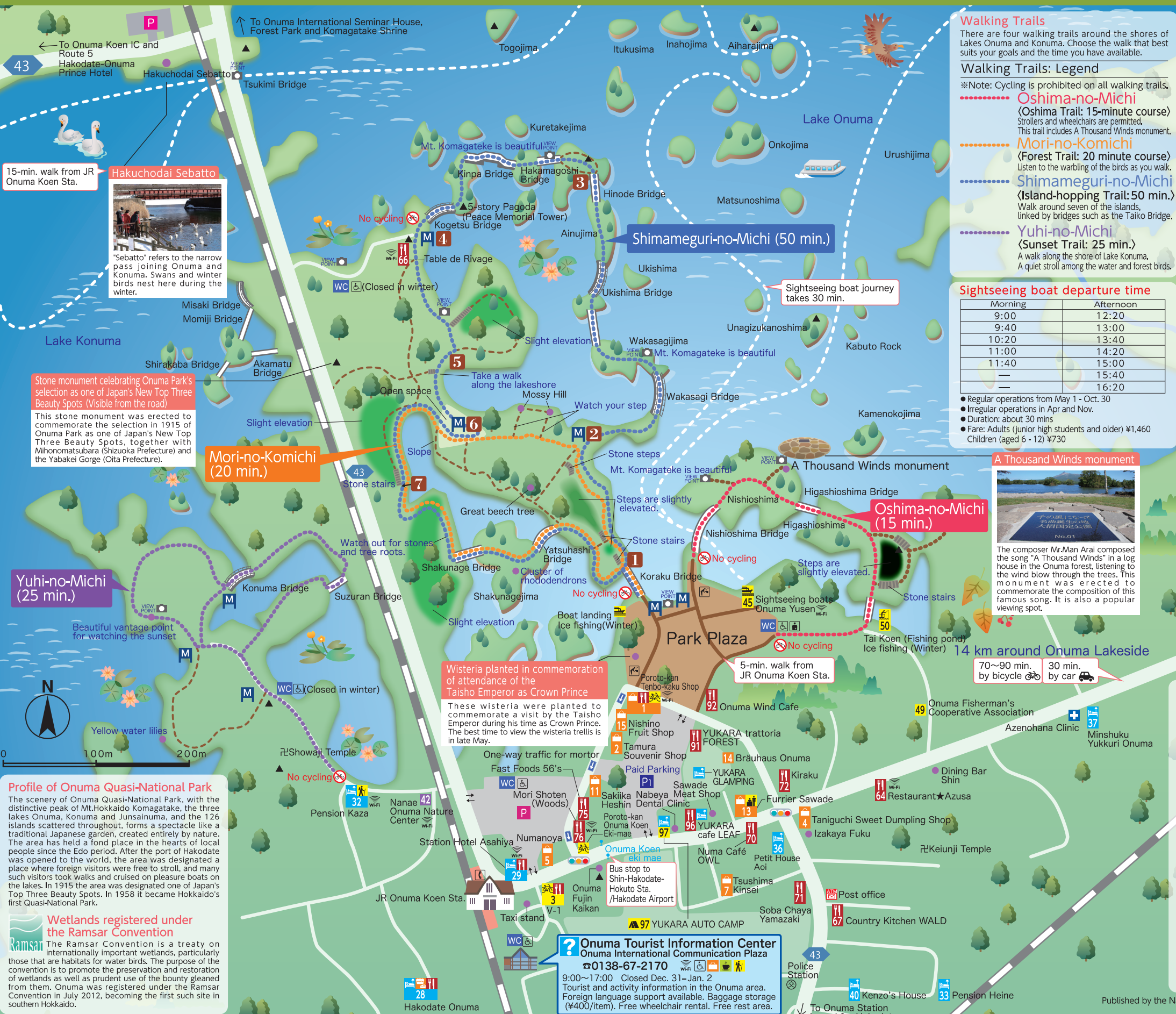




Walking Trails

There are four walking trails around the shores of Lakes Onuma and Konuma. Choose the walk that best suits your goals and the time you have available.

Walking Trails: Legend

※Note: Cycling is prohibited on all walking trails.

- Oshima-no-Michi**
(Oshima Trail: 15-minute course)
Strollers and wheelchairs are permitted. This trail includes A Thousand Winds monument.
- Mori-no-Komichi**
(Forest Trail: 20 minute course)
Listen to the warbling of the birds as you walk.
- Shimameguri-no-Michi**
(Island-hopping Trail: 50 min.)
Walk around seven of the islands, linked by bridges such as the Taiko Bridge.
- Yuhi-no-Michi**
(Sunset Trail: 25 min.)
A walk along the shore of Lake Konuma. A quiet stroll among the water and forest birds.

Profile of Onuma Quasi-National Park

The scenery of Onuma Quasi-National Park, with the distinctive peak of Mt.Hokkaido Komagatake, the three lakes Onuma, Konuma and Junsainuma, and the 126 islands scattered throughout, forms a spectacle like a traditional Japanese garden, created entirely by nature. The area has held a fond place in the hearts of local people since the Edo period. After the port of Hakodate was opened to the world, the area was designated a place where foreign visitors were free to stroll, and many such visitors took walks and cruised on pleasure boats on the lakes. In 1915 the area was designated one of Japan's Top Three Beauty Spots. In 1958 it became Hokkaido's first Quasi-National Park.

Wetlands registered under the Ramsar Convention

The Ramsar Convention is a treaty on internationally important wetlands, particularly those that are habitats for water birds. The purpose of the convention is to promote the preservation and restoration of wetlands as well as prudent use of the bounty gleaned from them. Onuma was registered under the Ramsar Convention in July 2012, becoming the first such site in southern Hokkaido.
